### Law of Negligence



- Defendant owed plaintiff a legal duty of care.
- Breach of duty.
- Damage was suffered.
- Causation between breach and damage

#### Law of Negligence

- Neighbour rule: [any person closely affected by your conduct, and whom you should reasonably forsee might be injured by you]
- Donoghue v. Stevenson (1932)
